Description

Bronze, consisting of skull, brim, and comb. The skull is rounded, its brow is embossed with two pair of curving ribs filled by raised

dots. A Hercules mask is applied on the brow between the bands. High on either side of the skull below the comb is a domed bosset. Remnants of mounts on the interior edges of the skull indicate that cheekpieces, and probably a face guard, were once fitted. The perimeter of the skull is fitted with holes for lining rivets. Attached to the skull by curved and riveted arms is a broad, downcurving brim that deepens at the sides towards the front. There is a small loop under the back edge of the brim. Riveted to the top of the skull is a tall, curving riveted comb with sides embossed with raised plain panels in a fan-like manner. The comb is open above for a crest (likely horsehair, perhaps colored), and ends at the basal rear in a curving "tail" with balustered terminal. A lion's head is applied to the anterior end of the comb.
